In particular, it is important that the person who holds a Full (Club) licence actually <i>represents</i> that club.

1.Whether Clause 2(1)(a) should state expressly that Full (Reciprocal) Licenses can operate from Maritime Mobile Locations;	Ofcom has decided to retain the wording of the variation as proposed in the First Notification, on the basis that we consider this sufficiently clear. In particular, it is implicit that Full (Reciprocal) Licences will be included within the scope of the provision where they have not been excluded in the same way as Full (Club) and Temporary Licences have been.
2. Whether it would be helpful to amalgamate the clauses relating to Regional Secondary Locators ('RSLs') and to reword Clause 2(3) so as to make clear that the RSL 'E' only applies to callsigns beginning with '2'.	Ofcom has decided to retain the wording of the variation as proposed in the First Notification, as we consider it sufficient to give effect to the policy decisions in the Amateur Radio Statement. Taken together, Clauses 2(2) and 2(3) make it plain that the RSL 'E' is only to be used where a call sign has the prefix '2'. The call sign prefix '2' is available only under an Intermediate licence and is not available under a Club licence.
