
Ofcom Licensing – October 2025 Update

Ofcom Phases-2/3 – Summary

Previously...

- The current licence was introduced in Feb 2024 (aka Phase-1)
- However Phases-2/3 associated with callsign changes were deferred

October 2025...

Most remaining changes now introduced in the Ofcom online portal:-

- Intermediate callsigns moving from 2x0 / 2x1 to M8 / M9
- Special Event callsigns now more flexible
- Other callsign changes and limits
- Other Ofcom portal changes including a stronger password requirement









Intermediate Calls

Existing Intermediate calls can be **Amended** based on:

- 2#0xyx >>>> **M8xyz**

- 2#1xyx >>>> M9xyz

Where # is a mandatory RSL for the 2 series, but optional for M8/9

Notes:

- Not automatic You must amend your intermediate call on the Ofcom Portal
- New Intermediates: Can choose from other available M8 or M9 calls. Not 2s
- Existing Intermediates: Reservations for your current 'xyz' expire after 5 years

Special Event Stations

Previously...

- Standard format GBnxyz available via the Ofcom portal
- 'Special-SES' such as GB25xyz or GB100xyz was a manual process

Now...

- Single Liberalised GBdcccca format available via the Ofcom portal
 - d=digit (but not 3 or 7 as used by repeaters/beacons)
 - c=digit or letter
 - a=letter









Callsign Changes and Limits

Previously...

- Lower licence level callsigns retained as you passed exams
- Many cases of multiple personal callsigns, notably at Full
- Restrictions on changing personal callsigns

Now...

- Automatic revocation of lower calls as you progress or change
- Maximum of 5 callsigns (eg if holding multiple club calls)
- Ability to change a personal call once every five years
- Gradual move to one personal callsign per licensee








